Vaccines recommended in B.C.



ADULTS

HPV

- Vaccine recommended up to age 45, for healthy individuals or those who are immunocompromised.
- Free if the first dose is given between ages 9 and 20, and the second dose before age 26 (inclusive).
- The vaccine is also covered from ages 9 to 45 for:
 - cisgender men, as well as Two-Spirit, transgender, and/or non-binary people,
 - people living with HIV,
 - and those who have received post-colposcopy treatment for cervical dysplasia on or after July 31, 2025.

INFLUENZA (FLU)

- Recommended for everyone aged 18 and over, every year before flu season, and especially for those at higher risk (pregnant individuals, people with chronic illnesses, healthcare providers, those in contact with high-risk patients or living in long-term care facilities, people in contact with children under 5, as well as first responders in community services).
- Free for everyone.

PERTUSSIS (WHOOPING COUGH)

- It is recommended to receive at least one booster dose during adulthood.
- The vaccine is not free unless you fall into one of the following two categories:
 - Recommended during each pregnancy for pregnant individuals,
 - Recommended for those who have not received all their doses or who are unsure of their vaccination history.

SHINGLES

- Recommended from age 50, even for those who have had chickenpox or have been vaccinated against chickenpox or with the live shingles vaccine.
- Not free

TETANUS/DIPHTERIA

- Single Td vaccine, recommended every 10 years. Free of charge.
- May be offered within 5 years in case of a high-risk injury
- Recommended if vaccination history is unknown.

PNEUMOCOCCAL CONJUGATE

- Vaccine recommended for people over 65 and for vulnerable individuals.
- Free of charge.

RSV (RESPIRATORY SYNCYTIAL VIRUS)

- Recommended for:
 - people aged 75 and over,
 - people aged 60 and over living in nursing homes or other long-term care facilities,
 - pregnant individuals between the 32nd and 36th week of pregnancy.
- Not free
